

Editorial & Peer Review Process:

1. All manuscripts submitted to Genetic Clinics are subject to peer review process.
2. The Editorial Board checks the article for compliance with the rules of styling and the scope of the journal. Then the article is sent for reviewing to experts whose professional expertise/ research interests are the closest to the issues covered in the article.
3. The reviewing period is limited to 4 weeks.
4. The reviewer is requested to address the following issues:
 - i. whether the content of the article is appropriate for the journal
 - ii. whether the article is satisfactory in terms of style, language, content & clarity
 - iii. whether the findings in the article are consistent with previously published literature on the same topic
 - iv. suggestions, if any, for improvement of the content
 - v. suitability for acceptance
5. If the reviewer recommends revision of the article, the Editor sends the corresponding author the details of the review and requests them to revise the article accordingly. The author can provide arguments to defend his/her point of view. The revised article may be sent for re-reviewing, if required.
6. In case the article is not found to be suitable for acceptance, the reasons for rejection are sent to the corresponding author by e-mail.
7. In case the article is found suitable for acceptance, the Editor informs the author regarding the same, with the possible date of publication.
8. The original reviewer comments are maintained by the Editorial Office for five years and can be provided to the competent authorities on request.
