All submissions are analysed to determine whether they are within the appropriate ethical framework. Submissions are accepted by the journal only when they have been approved by the Institutional Ethics Committee of the author(s). If any content is found to be ethically unacceptable by the Editorial Board, the paper is not accepted for publication and the author(s) are informed about the same. At present the journal does not publish articles based on animal studies.

If the manuscript contains any information pertaining to a patient(s), it should include a statement that informed consent was obtained from the patient or guardian. All photographs of patients should be accompanied by a signed consent for publication, from the patient or guardian.
